Opening: "Wooster Enterprises," at Churner & Churner

The late 1970s in New York was a fertile time for artists seeking to offer their work to a broad market at cheap prices. The Collaborative Projects group—Colab, for short—did this perhaps most famously with its stores, but they were hardly the only ones in the game. Churner & Churner offers up this summer show about Wooster Enterprises, a Soho-based outfit run by Jaime Davidovich and Judith Henry that created and distributed artist-made design work, "an overlooked antecedent to the MoMA Design Store, Takashi Murakami's Kaikai Kiki, and other art/design hybrid ventures," the gallery writes in its release. —A.R.
